

Hospital Acquired Malnutrition: What does it mean for you?

Malnutrition in the acute hospital setting is now well established. Patients may be malnourished on admission or develop malnutrition while in hospital. During this webinar, A/Professor Sharon Carey will introduce Hospital Acquired Malnutrition (HAM) and how individuals can be identified in the hospital setting. She will deep dive into the importance of documentation, explore the main reasons for HAM and the requirements for reporting.

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Sharon works as the Director of Allied Health Research & Education for the Institute of Academic Surgery at the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital and is also involved in the strategic management of dietitians and dietitian assistants.

Currently Sharon is also part of strategic committees including President of the Australasian Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition (AuSPEN); and co-chair of the NSW Agency for Clinical Innovation Home enteral Nutrition Network.

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
